Afterglow


Many of you perhaps had the opportunity to attend a large worship service involving many congregations for the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The large crowd of worshippers, the special music, and the powerful messages undoubtedly stirred your hearts and continued the process of reforming and re-forming your hearts. This special anniversary day took on additional meaning for us at the Wartburg Project because it was the day we completed the translation of the Evangelical Heritage Version.

In addition to the joy of the celebration which was great enough, we had the additional joy of hearing encouraging words and thanks from many of you at the special gatherings. Our work on the study Bible was also supported by receiving a part of the offering from one of the large district Reformation services and from a state teachers conference. The special festival was a good time to remind yourselves that your work on and support for the translation work and the other educational materials of our project are a part, however small, of our work of turning loose the Word so that the Spirit continues the work of reformation and re-formation of the church and the world.

2017 Preview Edition

The 2017 Reformation Anniversary Edition of the EHV New Testament and Psalms has been on sale for about six months now and distribution is going well. Over 10,000 have been sold and distributed, including gift copies to faculty and students of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, Martin Luther College, Bethany Lutheran College and Seminary, Wisconsin Lutheran College, Luther Preparatory School, and Michigan Lutheran Seminary due to generous gifts for that purpose. We have also been able to distribute gift copies to several state teachers conferences.

Kindle and Nook versions are available from Amazon and Barnes and Noble.



We are continuing the delivery of review copies to various Lutheran, Baptist, and Evangelical periodicals and to scholars of various denominations for review. We are beginning to receive responses and hope for reviews in the near future.

The New Testament and Psalms of the EHV is now available on Biblegateway! This makes EHV available in many other ways too. We are also discussing BibleGateway, Bibleworks, and LOGOS programs for the whole Bible.

Translation and Setup Work

The translation of the Old Testament has been completed. Malachi, the last book to be finished, was submitted on October 31, 2017, a day of symbolical importance to a project named the Wartburg Project. Although the basic translation work is done, there still is a lot of work to do in preparing the texts for printing. This will take some time.

Our second-time-around proofreading of the NPH printouts of the Old Testament has been completed through Lamentations. Third-level proofreading is now underway on Ezekiel and Daniel. A final fourth check is also being made of the final setups of Genesis through Chronicles.

Passion History

The revised passion history will again be available for use during Lent 2018. It is available free of charge on our website. If there is sufficient interest, spiral-bound lectern copies can be made available as print-on-demand.

A HARMONY OF THE GOSPELS

A harmony of the gospels based on the EHV text is in the process of editing at Northwestern Publishing House.

CHILDREN'S BIBLE STORY BOOK

A children's Bible story book based on the EHV text is being written.

LECTIONARY

The files for the 2017-2018 lectionaries used in WELS and LCMS congregations have been posted for the Advent/Christmas season and the rest will follow. Epiphany lessons should be posted soon. Congregations may download and use these free of charge in their bulletins, on screen, or in online postings of their services and classes. You may have to use a special paste option to preserve all the formatting in certain platforms. Please contact us about any technical problems or typos that escaped detection.

The Wartburg Project is willing to grant permission to use EHV to the producers of other lectionary systems.

Derived Works (continued)

THE FIRST EHV CATECHISM

The first catechism to use the EHV text, A Brief Exposition of Luther's Small Catechism, is a 21st century updating of the Synodical Conference catechism by H. C. Schwan. It is being tested in a number of LCMS congregations.

We hope other catechisms using the EHV will follow. Authors of catechisms and other catechetical materials can use up to 1000 verses of the EHV without permission.

THE EHV STUDY BIBLE

Planning and initial work on the EHV Study Bible is underway, including the gathering of maps and charts. We currently have drafts completed for ten Old Testament books. See the chart at the end of the report. We are adding archaeological, historical, geographical, and doctrinal information to a Word format file with popup footnotes and maps. These initial files will be further developed by committees of editor/reviewers.

We are also testing the feasibility of producing various additional electronic formats such as an electronic Bible in landscape format, with the left side of the screen Biblical text and the right side of the screen scrolling notes. Maps and charts will be accessed through links to pop-ups. We welcome suggestions concerning the content and formats of the study Bible.

We are also working at obtaining and getting the necessary permissions for maps, charts, and pictures.

Other Uses

We are continuing to receive inquiries or requests about using EHV in various study Bibles and commentaries. We hope to be able to act on more of these as completion of the Old Testament gets closer.

If you are working on a project for which you would like to use the EHV text, no permission is needed to use up to 1000 verses, unless the selection includes whole books of the Bible. For uses beyond 1000 verses, licenses are available on favorable terms. An appropriate EHV copyright notice should be posted on the copyright page of the work in question.

If you would like to see a product based on the EHV, contact the Wartburg Project if WP would be the expected publisher of the product, but if the expected publisher would be a publishing house or a producer of Bible software, express your interest in the product to the potential producer (for example, to LOGOS or NPH). The more market interest there is, the sooner a product appears.




It may be too late for this year's programs, but we've also attached an encore of the EHV version of the Christmas story in song.


