NPH has issued order forms for bulk purchases of the whole Bible. This is the way to get the best price for your members and students and for gift copies to institutions.



Jericho and Ai are two of the biblical sites that generate the most debate. Many scholars allege that the archaeological evidence from the sites contradicts the biblical accounts of the sites. This article shows that the archaeological evidence from the site can be harmonized with the biblical data. This type of entry in our online library will provide more detailed, in-depth information than is possible in the notes of the study Bible. The study Bible will provide references to these articles.

Coming Studies

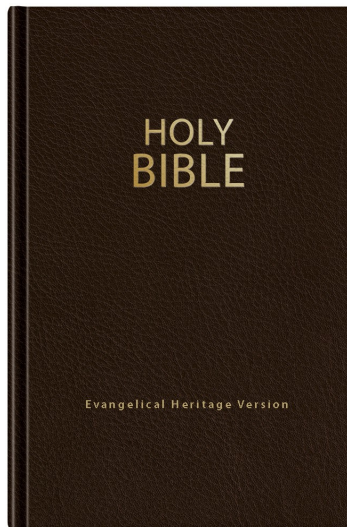
