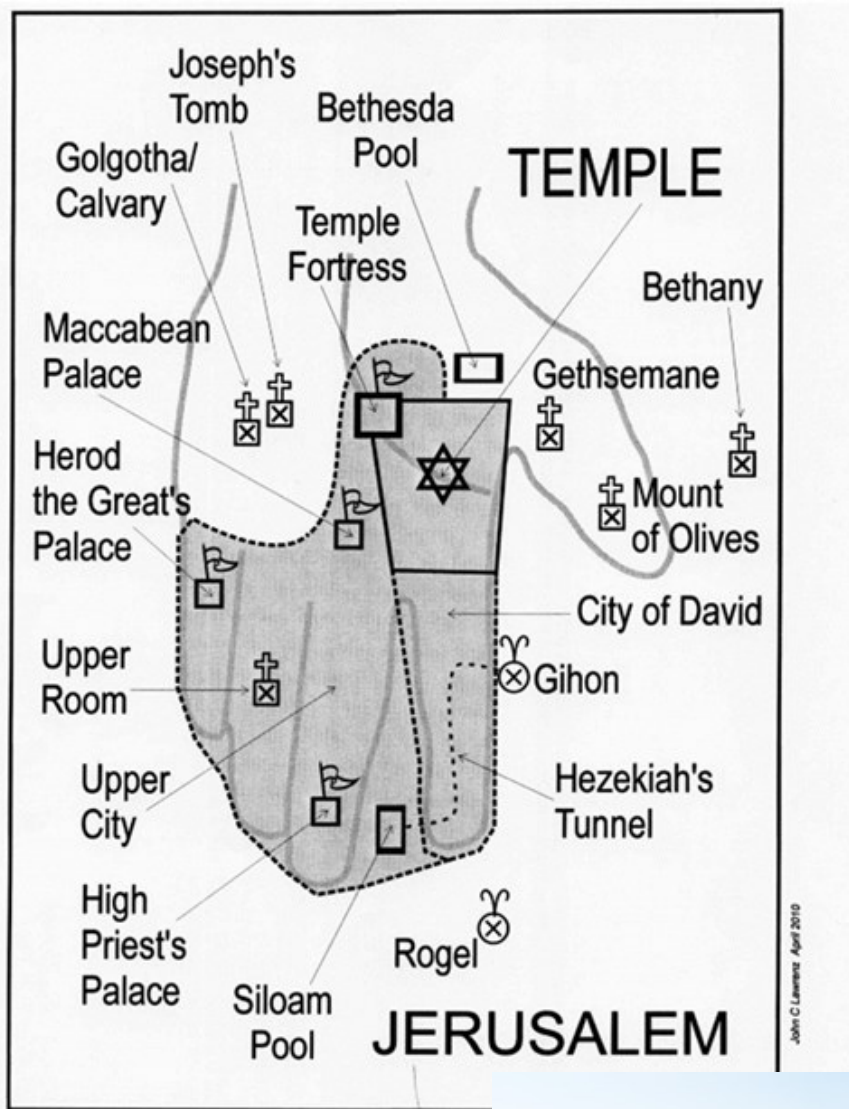

The picture below places some of the sites on the model of Jerusalem at the Israel Museum.





This map proposes locations for important events of Holy Week. Some of these locations are debated. The EHV accepts the location of the trial before Pilate in the Praetorium with the Antonia fortress at the northwest corner of the Temple and the location of Calvary and the tomb at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

### Gifts for Africa and Asia

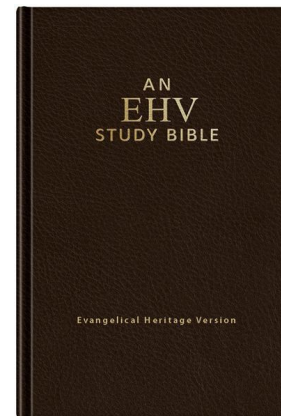
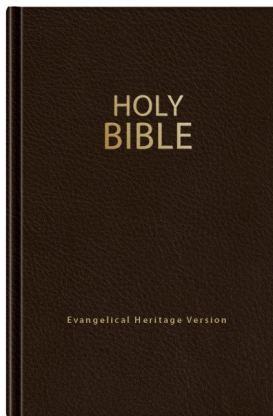
