Find on His Table free cleansing from sin. You cannot afford it. But just come on in. He'll welcome and feed you without any cost. His pleasure is finding and feeding the lost.

Go from His Supper with spirit revived, At peace with your Lord and by his gift alive. Then tell of this Fine Food so others may learn That Christ serves the Great Feast His sacrifice earned.
