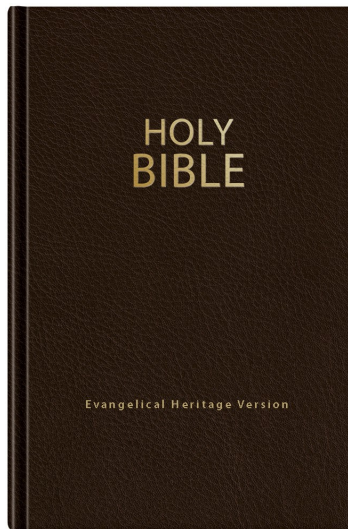


2. **A more detailed description of the EHV Study Bible for Windows computers.**
