Progress Report

NT The editing of the New Testament has been completed and now the material is in the hands of NPH. There can still be some tweaks and corrections during proofreading.

PSALMS The edition of Psalms for the 2017 publication is finished, but additional input can still be considered through mid-January.

OT Drafts have been completed for 25 Old Testament books, and parts of a large number of additional books. There are only two books of the Old Testament that are not being worked on. There are no books on which nothing has been done.

What Now?

During the first week of December we hit a milestone of sorts. There were no technical reviews which had not been processed. That bin was empty. That lasted about two days, and now the hopper is starting to fill up again. Late November and early December was the biggest four week period for assigning reviews and acceptance of assignments. We hope, God willing, to have quite a few OT books available for popular review in the not too distant future. We hope to post a couple of sample books on Amazon similar to the Matthew project. The first edition of the Passion History is still available.

Names

We are checking the availability of domain names and trademarking for terms and names for the Bible translation that got the most positive feedback during our testing and during our evaluation process. Once we have cleared the legal hurdles, we can announce the names we will use.
