## **Progress Reports**

#### **TRANSLATION**

We expect the draft translation of Job to be completed this month (though it will still need a lot of work). The draft translation of Zechariah is nearly complete. These are the last two books to be translated.

#### **EDITING**

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles have been handed in to Northwestern Publishing House. The parallel texts in Kings and Chronicles were harmonized to a considerable degree. The editing of Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther is complete except for final proofreading.

#### 2017 Preview Edition

Final proofreading of the Northwestern Publishing House print-outs for the 2017 preview edition of the New Testament and Psalms is nearing completion. The 500th anniversary of the Reformation is only a year away.

#### LECTIONARIES

The lessons for the first half of the 2016-2017 church year (both those used in WELS and in the LCMS) are now live for downloading at the Lectionaries link on our website free of charge for anyone who would like examine them or use them. Some congregations are beginning to use them. The other main purpose is to give you an opportunity to examine a large sample of the EHV translation. Remember that the Old Testament lessons, especially the prophets have not yet undergone final editing. We can still incorporate changes in them. Please report any typos.

The readings for the second half of the year will be made operative well before the time for their use.

# Evangelical Heritage Version® or EHV®

As of December 6 it is official. We have received notices from the US Patent and Trademark Office that our Evangelical Heritage Version and EHV trademarks have been approved and registered and that we may now use them as officially registered trademarks with the ® symbol. The USPTO sends out frameable certificates with a nice gold seal.
