Lectionaries



It is interesting to monitor the hits on our Wartburg Project resources which are posted on *Academia*, a site for sharing academic research worldwide. We have received hits from well over 50 countries. In one week our chart of the 150 psalms received hits from Singapore, Malaysia, India, and the Cook Islands. Most of the hits are not from people seeking information about the EHV but doing biblical research. Electronic Study Bibles for Windows Computers

For teachers and classes, we are especially excited about the electronic edition of the EHV Study Bible. When this program is run in landscape mode on a Windows computer, the EHV text displays on the left half of the screen, and notes on translation, history, archaeology, geography, and doctrine, along with numerous maps and pictures, can be made to scroll along with the text on the right half of the screen. In a typical classroom it can be projected on a smartboard in a size that can be read by the students. The Study Bible also includes introductions to each book, as well as articles on textual variants, chronology, the Herods, geography, and so on. In addition to its use for classroom display, this work is invaluable for teacher preparation. This EHV Study Bible is a Microsoft app which is sold through the Microsoft Store. 
