# The Epiphany of our Lord

### **Old Testament**

### Isaiah 60:1-6

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD is dawning upon you. <sup>2</sup>Look, darkness covers the earth, and deep darkness covers the peoples, but the LORD will dawn upon you, and his glory will be seen over you. <sup>3</sup>Nations will walk to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. <sup>4</sup>Look up. Look all around and see! All of them have been gathered. They are coming to you. Your sons will come from far away, and people will carry your daughters on their side. <sup>5</sup>Then you will look and be radiant. Your heart will race with excitement and burst with joy. For great riches from the sea will be delivered to you. The wealth of the nations will come to you. <sup>6</sup>Caravans of camels will cover your land, young camels from Midian and Ephah. All those from Sheba will come. They will carry gold and incense, and they will announce the good news of the praise of the LORD.

# **Epistle**

### Ephesians 3:1-12

For this reason, I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—<sup>2</sup>Surely you have heard of the administration of God's grace given to me for you, <sup>3</sup>namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation (as I have already written briefly). <sup>4</sup>When you read this, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ. <sup>5</sup>This mystery was not made known to people in past generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets. <sup>6</sup>This mystery is that in Christ Jesus the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and people who also share in the promise through the gospel.

<sup>7</sup>I became a servant of this gospel, in keeping with the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. <sup>8</sup>To me—even though I am the very least of all the saints—was given this grace: to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ <sup>9</sup>and to enlighten everyone about the administration of this mystery. In past ages this mystery remained hidden in God, who created

all things. <sup>10</sup>He did this so that, through the church, the multifaceted wisdom of God in the heavenly places might now be made known to the rulers and authorities. <sup>11</sup>This was done according to the eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. <sup>12</sup>In him we can freely approach God with confidence through faith in him.

# **Holy Gospel**

### Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, when Herod was king, Wise Men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, <sup>2</sup>"Where is he who has been born King of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." <sup>3</sup>When King Herod heard this, he was alarmed, and all Jerusalem with him. <sup>4</sup>He gathered together all the people's chief priests and experts in the law. He asked them where the Christ was to be born. <sup>5</sup>They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, because this was written through the prophet:

<sup>6</sup>You, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are certainly not least among the rulers of Judah: because out of you will come a ruler, who will shepherd my people, Israel."

<sup>7</sup>Then Herod secretly summoned the Wise Men and found out from them exactly when the star had appeared. <sup>8</sup>He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you find him, report to me, so that I may also go and worship him."

<sup>9</sup>After listening to the king, they went on their way. Then the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them, until it stood still over the place where the child was. <sup>10</sup>When they saw the star, they rejoiced with overwhelming joy. <sup>11</sup>After they went into the house and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. <sup>12</sup>Since they had been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route.

# The First Sunday after the Epiphany or The Baptism of our Lord

### **Old Testament**

### 1 Kings 8:6-13

<sup>6</sup>The priests brought the Ark of the Covenant of the LORD to its place in the inner sanctuary of the house, to the Most Holy Place, under the wings of the cherubim, <sup>7</sup>for the cherubim were spreading their wings over the place for the ark, so that the cherubim covered the ark and its poles with their wings. <sup>8</sup>The poles were so long that the ends of the poles could be seen from the Holy Place in front of the inner sanctuary, but they could not be seen from outside. They are there to this day.

<sup>9</sup>There was nothing in the ark except the two stone tablets, which Moses had placed there at Horeb, where the LORD made a covenant with the people of Israel when they came out of the land of Egypt.

<sup>10</sup>When the priests came out from the Holy Place, the cloud filled the House of the LORD. <sup>11</sup>The priests were not able to take their positions to minister in the presence of the cloud, because the Glory of the LORD had filled the House of the LORD.

<sup>12</sup>Then Solomon said, "The LORD has said that he dwells in thick darkness. <sup>13</sup>I have truly built a majestic house for you, a place for you to dwell forever."

or

#### Joshua 3:1-3, 7-8, 13-17

After Joshua had gotten up early in the morning, he and all the Israelites set out from Shittim and arrived at the Jordan. They stayed there until they crossed over. <sup>2</sup>After three days the officers went through the camp <sup>3</sup>and gave this order to the people: "As soon as you see the priests from the tribe of Levi carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the LORD your God, you are to set out from your position and follow the ark.

<sup>7</sup>The LORD said to Joshua, "Today I will begin to exalt you in the eyes of all Israel so that they will know that just as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. <sup>8</sup>You are the one who will give this order to the priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant: 'As soon as you come to the edge of the water of the Jordan, you are to stand still in the Jordan.'"

<sup>13</sup>As soon as the soles of the feet of the priests carrying the Ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth, come to rest in the waters of the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan flowing down from upstream will be cut off, and they will stand up in one heap."

<sup>14</sup>So the people set out from their tents to cross the Jordan, and the priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant went ahead of the people. <sup>15</sup>As soon as the priests carrying the ark came to the Jordan, and as soon as their feet dipped into the edge of the water (the Jordan is full and overflows all its banks

during all the days of the grain harvest), <sup>16</sup>the waters flowing down from upstream came to a standstill. The waters piled up in one heap, very far away, at Adam, the town that is next to Zarethan, and the waters flowing down to the Sea of the Arabah, that is, the Salt Sea, were completely cut off. So the people crossed the Jordan opposite Jericho. <sup>17</sup>The priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the LORD stood on dry ground in the middle of the Jordan while all Israel was crossing over on dry ground, until the entire nation had finished crossing the Jordan.

or

#### Isaiah 42:1-7

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight. I am placing my Spirit on him. He will announce a just verdict for the nations. <sup>2</sup>He will not cry out. He will not raise his voice. He will not make his voice heard in the street. <sup>3</sup>A bent reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not snuff out. He will faithfully bring forth a just verdict. <sup>4</sup>He will not burn out, and he will not be broken until he establishes justice on the earth. The coastlands will wait for his law. <sup>5</sup>This is what the true God says, the LORD who creates the heavens and stretches them out, who spreads out the earth and everything that it produces, who gives breath to the people on it and life to those who walk on it. <sup>6</sup>I am the LORD.

I have called you in righteousness.

I will hold on to your hand,
and I will guard you.

I will appoint you to be a covenant for the people,
to be a light for the nations,

to open the eyes of the blind,
to bring the prisoners out from the dungeon,
and to bring those who sit in darkness out of prison.

### **Epistle**

### Romans 12:1-5

Therefore I urge you, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice—holy and pleasing to God—which is your appropriate worship. <sup>2</sup>Also, do not continue to conform to

the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, so that you test and approve what is the will of God—what is good, pleasing, and perfect.

<sup>3</sup>So by the grace given to me, I tell everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought, but think in a way that results in sound judgment, as God distributed a measure of faith to each of you. <sup>4</sup>For we have many members in one body, and not all the members have the same function. <sup>5</sup>In the same way, though we are many, we are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another.

or

### 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

<sup>26</sup>For example, consider your call, brothers. Not many of you were wise from a human point of view, not many were powerful, and not many were born with high status. <sup>27</sup>But God chose the foolish things of the world to put to shame those who are wise. God chose the weak things of the world to put to shame the things that are strong, <sup>28</sup>and God chose the lowly things of the world and the despised things, and the things that are not, to do away with the things that are, <sup>29</sup>so that no one may boast before God. <sup>30</sup>But because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us the wisdom from God, namely, our righteousness and sanctification and redemption. <sup>31</sup>God did this so that, just as it is written, "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord."

# **Holy Gospel**

#### Luke 2:41-52

<sup>41</sup>Every year his parents traveled to Jerusalem for the Passover Festival. <sup>42</sup>When he was twelve years old, they went up according to the custom of the Festival. <sup>43</sup>When the days had ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it. <sup>44</sup>Since they thought he was in their group, they went a day's journey. Then they began to look for him among their relatives and friends. <sup>45</sup>When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him.

<sup>46</sup>After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. <sup>47</sup>And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. <sup>48</sup>When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us this way? See, your father and I have been anxiously looking for you."

<sup>49</sup>He said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be taking care of my Father's business?" <sup>50</sup>They did not understand what he was telling them.

<sup>51</sup>He went down with them and came to Nazareth. He was always obedient to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart. <sup>52</sup>Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and with people.

or

<sup>13</sup>Then Jesus came from Galilee to be baptized by John at the Jordan. <sup>14</sup>But John tried to stop him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you come to me?"

<sup>15</sup>But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, because it is proper for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then John let him. <sup>16</sup>After Jesus was baptized, he immediately went up out of the water. Suddenly, the heavens were opened for him! He saw the Spirit of God, descending like a dove and landing on him, <sup>17</sup>and a voice out of the heavens said, "This is my Son, whom I love. I am well pleased with him."

### **Old Testament**

### Exodus 33:12-23

<sup>12</sup>Moses said to the LORD, "Look, you yourself have been telling me, 'Lead this people up,' but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' <sup>13</sup>So now if I have found favor in your sight, please show me your ways, so that I may know you, so that I may find favor in your sight. Consider that this nation is your people."

<sup>14</sup>The LORD said, "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."

<sup>15</sup>Moses said to him, "If your Presence is not going to go with me, do not send us up from here. <sup>16</sup>After all, how would people know that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people? Isn't it in this way: that you go with us, so that we are distinguished, I and your people, from all the people who are on the face of the earth?"

<sup>17</sup>The LORD said to Moses, "I will also do this thing that you have said, for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name."

<sup>18</sup>ThenMoses said, "Please show me your glory."

<sup>19</sup>The LORD said, "I will make all my goodness pass in front of you, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD in your presence. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and I will show mercy to whom I will show mercy." <sup>20</sup>He said, "You cannot see my face, for no human may see me and live."

<sup>21</sup>The LORD also said, "Look, there is a place next to me, where you shall stand on the rock. <sup>22</sup>It will happen that, while my glory passes by, I will put you in a crevice in the rock. I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by. <sup>23</sup>Then I will take away my hand, and you will see my back. But my face will not be seen."

or

#### Amos 9:11-15

<sup>11</sup>In that day I will raise up the fallen shelter of David.

I will repair the broken parts of its walls, and I will raise up its ruins.

I will rebuild it as in days of old,

<sup>12</sup>so that they will possess what remains of Edom, that is, all the nations who are called by my name, declares the LORD, who is doing this.

<sup>13</sup>Look, days are coming, declares the LORD, when the plowman will catch up with the reaper, and the one who tramples grapes will catch up with the one sowing the seed. The mountains will drip sweet wine,

and all the hills will wave with grain.

14I will restore the fortunes of my people Israel, and they will rebuild the desolate cities and dwell in them. They will plant vineyards and drink their wine, and they will make gardens and eat their fruit.

15I will plant them in their soil, and they will never again be uprooted from the soil that I have given to them, says the LORD your God.

### **Epistle**

### **Ephesians 5:22-33**

<sup>22</sup>Wives, submit to your own husbands as to the Lord. <sup>23</sup>Forthe husband is the head of the wife, just as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he himself is the Savior. <sup>24</sup>Moreover, as the church submits to Christ, so also wives are to submit to their husbands in everything.

<sup>25</sup>Husbands, love your wives, in the same way as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her <sup>26</sup>to make her holy, by cleansing her with the washing of water in connection with the Word. <sup>27</sup>He did this so that he could present her to himself as a glorious church, having no stain or wrinkle or any such thing, but so that she would be holy and blameless. <sup>28</sup>In the same way, husbands have an obligation to love their own wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. <sup>29</sup>To be sure, no one has ever hated his own body, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, <sup>30</sup>because we are members of his body, of his flesh and of his bones. <sup>31</sup>"For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will be one flesh." <sup>32</sup>This is a great mystery, but I am talking about Christ and the church. <sup>33</sup>In any case, each one of you also is to love his wife as himself, and each wife is to respect her husband.

or

#### Romans 12:6-16

<sup>6</sup>We have different gifts, according to the grace God has given us. If the gift is prophecy, do it in complete agreement with the faith. <sup>7</sup>If it is serving, then serve. If it is teaching, then teach. <sup>8</sup>If it is encouraging, then encourage. If it is contributing, be generous. If it is leadership, be diligent. If it is showing mercy, do it cheerfully.

<sup>9</sup>Do not just pretend to love others. Hate what is evil. Cling to what is good. <sup>10</sup>Be devoted to one another with brotherly love. Think of others as deserving more honor than yourselves. <sup>11</sup>Do not be lagging behind in zeal, but be fervent in spirit, as you continue to serve the Lord. <sup>12</sup>Be joyful in hope. Endure trials patiently. Persist in prayer. <sup>13</sup>Share with the saints who are in need. Be quick to welcome strangers as guests.

<sup>14</sup>Bless those who persecute you; bless, and do not curse. <sup>15</sup>Rejoice with those who are rejoicing; weep with those who are weeping. <sup>16</sup>Have the same respect for one another. Do not be arrogant, but associate with the humble. Do not think too highly of yourselves.

### **Holy Gospel**

### John 2:1-11

Three days later, there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Jesus' mother was there. <sup>2</sup>Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding.

<sup>3</sup>When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no wine."

<sup>4</sup>Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does that have to do with you and me? My time has not come yet."

<sup>5</sup>His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

<sup>6</sup>Six stone water jars, which the Jews used for ceremonial cleansing, were standing there, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. <sup>7</sup>Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. <sup>8</sup>Then he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet." And they did.

<sup>9</sup>When the master of the banquet tasted the water that had now become wine, he did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew). The master of the banquet called the bridegroom <sup>10</sup>and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when the guests have had plenty to drink, then the cheaper wine. You saved the good wine until now!"

<sup>11</sup>This, the beginning of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed in Cana of Galilee. He revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

# The Third Sunday after the Epiphany

### **Old Testament**

### 2 Kings 5:1-15a

Na'aman, the commander of the king of Aram's army, was a great man in the opinion of his master. He was highly honored because the LORD had provided victory for Aram through him. Although he was a powerful warrior, he had leprosy.

<sup>2</sup>Raiding parties had once gone out from Aram and brought back a young girl. She served Na'aman's wife. <sup>3</sup>She said to her mistress, "I wish my master stood before the prophet who is in Samaria, because he would cure him of his leprosy."

<sup>4</sup>So Na'aman went and told his master what the servant girl from the land of Israel had said.

<sup>5</sup>Then the king of Aram said, "Go there. I will send a letter to the king of Israel." So Na'aman went, and he took ten talents of silver and six thousand shekels of gold and ten sets of clothing. <sup>6</sup>Then he took the letter to the king of Israel. The letter said, "Now, when you receive this letter, you will know that I am sending my officer Na'aman to you so that you can cure him of his leprosy."

<sup>7</sup>When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothing and said, "Am I God that I can kill and make alive? Why is he sending a man to me for me to heal him from his leprosy? See how he is looking for a pretext to fight against me."

<sup>8</sup>But when Elisha, the man of God, heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king: "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, and he will know that there is a prophet in Israel."

<sup>9</sup>So Na'aman went with his horses and chariots and stopped in front of the door of Elisha's house. <sup>10</sup>But Elisha sent a messenger out to him to say, "Go and wash seven times in the Jordan. Then your flesh will be restored and you will be clean."

<sup>11</sup>But Na'aman was angry and he left, saying, "Look, I said to myself, 'He will certainly come out and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God and wave his hand over the place, and I will be cured of the leprosy!' <sup>12</sup>Aren't the Abana and the Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Couldn't I wash in them and be cleansed?" So he turned and went away in a burning rage.

<sup>13</sup>But his servants approached and spoke to him. They said, "My father, if the prophet had told you to do some great thing, would you not do it? How much more when he says to you, 'Wash and be clean'?"

<sup>14</sup>So he went down and dipped in the Jordan seven times, just as the man of God had said. Then his flesh was restored like the flesh of a small child, and he was clean. <sup>15</sup>Then he and his whole escort went back to the man of God. He stood in front of Elisha and said, "To be sure, now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

### **Epistle**

### Romans 1:8-17

<sup>8</sup>First of all, I thank my God through Jesus Christ concerning all of you, because your faith is being reported all over the world. <sup>9</sup>To be sure, God, whom I serve with my spirit by proclaiming the gospel of his Son, is my witness to how constantly I make mention of you. In all my prayers, <sup>10</sup>I always ask if perhaps at last a way might be opened, if God wills, for me to come to you. <sup>11</sup>I certainly long to see you, in order that I may deliver some spiritual gift to you, so that you are strengthened—
<sup>12</sup>that is, when I am with you, that we will be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, yours and also mine.

<sup>13</sup>I do not want you to be unaware of the fact, brothers, that I have often planned to come to you but have been prevented from doing so until now. I wanted to have some fruit among you in the same way as I did among the rest of the Gentiles. <sup>14</sup>I have an obligation both to Greeks and non-Greeks, to the wise and to the foolish. <sup>15</sup>That is why I am eager to proclaim the gospel also to you who are in Rome.

<sup>16</sup>For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes—to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. <sup>17</sup>For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed by faith, for faith, just as it is written, "The righteous will live by faith."

or

#### Romans 12:16-21

<sup>16</sup>Have the same respect for one another. Do not be arrogant, but associate with the humble. Do not think too highly of yourselves.

<sup>17</sup>Do not pay anyone back evil for evil. Focus on those things that everyone considers noble. <sup>18</sup>If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, maintain peace with everyone. <sup>19</sup>Do not take revenge, dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath. For it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay," says the Lord. <sup>20</sup>But:

If your enemy is hungry, feed him;

if he is thirsty, give him a drink.

For by doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head.

# **Holy Gospel**

#### Matthew 8:1-13

When Jesus came down from the mountain, large crowds followed him. <sup>2</sup>Just then, a leper came to him and bowed down to him, saying, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>21</sup>Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

<sup>3</sup>Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean." Immediately he was healed of his leprosy. <sup>4</sup>Jesus said to him, "See that you tell no one. Instead, go, show yourself to the priest and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

<sup>5</sup>When he entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him and pleaded with him, <sup>6</sup>"Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed and suffering terribly."

<sup>7</sup>Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."

<sup>8</sup>The centurion answered, "Lord, I am not worthy for you to come under my roof. But only say the word, and my servant will be healed. <sup>9</sup>For I am also a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."

<sup>10</sup>When Jesus heard this, he marveled. He said to those who were following him, "Amen<sup>a</sup> I tell you: I have not found such great faith in anyone in Israel. <sup>11</sup>I tell you that many will come from the east and the west and will recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup>But the children of the kingdom will be thrown out into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

<sup>13</sup>Jesus said to the centurion, "Go. Let it be done for you as you have believed." And his servant was healed at that very hour.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>a</sup> Usually, people say Amen at the end of a prayer. But Jesus used this Hebrew word at the beginning of a statement, which was unique. The inspired writer simply transliterated the Hebrew word that Jesus spoke, instead of using a Greek term. This translation does the same in English. The basic meaning is I solemnly tell you the truth. For more information about this, see FAQ #1 at wartburgproject.org/faqs

# The Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany

### **Old Testament**

### Jonah 1:1-17

So the word of the LORD came to Jonah son of Amittai: <sup>2</sup>"Get up, go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach against it, for its people's evil way has come up before me."

<sup>3</sup>But Jonah set out to flee to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. He paid the fare and boarded the ship to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD.

<sup>4</sup>But the LORD hurled a great wind onto the sea, and there was such a great storm on the sea that the ship was about to break apart. <sup>5</sup>The sailors were afraid, and each one cried out to his gods. They threw the ship's cargo into the sea to lighten the ship's load.

Jonah had gone down into the hold of the ship. He was lying down and sleeping soundly. <sup>6</sup>The captain approached him and said, "How can you be sleeping so soundly? Get up and call on your god! Maybe your god will treat us with favor so that we will not perish."

<sup>7</sup>Then the sailors said to each other, "Come on, let's cast lots so that we can find out whose fault it is that this disaster has come to us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah.

<sup>29</sup>When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the Testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not realize that the skin of his face was shining because he had been speaking with the LORD. <sup>30</sup>When Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, they were amazed that the skin of his face was shining, so they were afraid to come close to him. <sup>31</sup>Moses called to them, so Aaron and all the rulers of the community returned to him, and Moses spoke to them. <sup>32</sup>Afterward all the people of Israel came close to him, and he gave them all of the commands that the LORD had spoken to him on Mount Sinai. <sup>33</sup>When Moses was finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face. <sup>34</sup>But whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off until he came out again. <sup>12</sup>So he said, "I will certainly be with you. This will be the sign to you that I have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will serve God on this mountain."

<sup>13</sup>ButMoses said to God, "If I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what should I say to them?"

<sup>14</sup>So God replied to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." He also said, "You will say this to the Israelites: I AM has sent me to you."

# **Epistle**

### 2 Peter 1:16-21

<sup>16</sup>To be sure, we were not following cunningly devised fables when we made known to you the powerful appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. <sup>17</sup>For he received honor and glory from God the Father, when the voice came to him from within the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." <sup>18</sup>We heard this voice, which came out of heaven when we were with him on the holy mountain.

<sup>19</sup>We also have the completely reliable prophetic word. Six days later Jesus took with him Peter, James, and John the brother of James; and he led them up onto a high mountain by themselves. <sup>2</sup>There he was transfigured in front of them. His face was shining like the sun. His clothing became as white as the light. <sup>3</sup>Just then, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Jesus.

<sup>4</sup>Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you want, I will make three shelters here: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

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### **Old Testament**

### Exodus 17:1-7

The entire Israelite community set out on their journey from the Wilderness of Sin as the LORD had commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. <sup>2</sup>So the people quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses said to them, "Why are you quarreling with me? Why are you testing the LORD?"

<sup>3</sup>But the people were thirsty for water there, so they grumbled against Moses. They said, "Why did you ever bring us up out of Egypt to let us, our children, and our livestock die of thirst?"

<sup>4</sup>Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with these people? They are almost ready to stone me!"

# **Epistle**

### 1 Corinthians 9:24-10:5

<sup>24</sup>Do you not know that when runners compete in the stadium, they all run, but only one receives the prize? Run like that—to win. <sup>25</sup>Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable victor's wreath, but we do it for an imperishable one. <sup>26</sup>That is why there is nothing aimless about the way I run. There is no pummeling of the air in the way I box. <sup>27</sup>Instead I hit my body hard and make it my slave so that, after preaching to others, I myself will not be rejected.

<sup>10:1</sup>For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea, <sup>2</sup>and they were all baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. <sup>3</sup>They all ate the same spiritual food <sup>4</sup>and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from the spiritual rock that accompanied them—and that rock was Christ! <sup>5</sup>Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them. He had them die in the wilderness.

### Matthew 20:1-16

"Indeed the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. <sup>2</sup>After agreeing to pay the workers a denarius for the day, he sent them into his vineyard. <sup>3</sup>He also went out about the third hour and saw others standing unemployed in the marketplace. <sup>4</sup>To these he said, 'You also go into the vineyard, and I will give you whatever is right.'

So they went. <sup>5</sup>Again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour and did the same thing. <sup>6</sup>When he went out about the eleventh hour, he found others standing unemployed. He said to them, 'Why have you stood here all day unemployed?'

<sup>7</sup>"They said to him, 'Because no one hired us.'

"He told them, 'You also go into the vineyard.' <sup>8</sup>When it was evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last group and ending with the first.'

But they each received a denarius too. <sup>11</sup>After they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner: <sup>12</sup>'Those who were last worked one hour, and you made them equal to us who have endured the burden of the day and the scorching heat!'

<sup>13</sup>"But he answered one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not make an agreement with me for a denarius? <sup>14</sup>Take what is yours and go. I want to give to the last one hired the same as I also gave to you. <sup>15</sup>Can't I do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?' <sup>16</sup>In the same way, the last will be first, and the first, last."

Isaiah 55:10-13

### 2 Corinthians 11:19-12:9

<sup>19</sup>You gladly put up with fools, since you are just so wise! <sup>20</sup>In fact, you put up with it if anyone makes you his slave, robs you, takes advantage of you, looks down on you, or strikes you in the face! <sup>21</sup>I am ashamed to say that we were too weak for that!

However bold anyone might be (I am speaking in a foolish way), I am going to be bold too. <sup>22</sup>Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they Abraham's seed? So am I. <sup>23</sup>Are they ministers of Christ? (I am speaking in a crazy way.) I am even more. I've done more hard work, been in prisons more often, been whipped far more, and I've been close to death many times. <sup>24</sup>Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. <sup>25</sup>Three times I was beaten with rods. One time I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked. I have spent a night and a day on the open sea. <sup>26</sup>I have often been on journeys, in danger from rivers, in danger from robbers, in danger from my own people, in danger from Gentiles, in danger in the city, in danger in the wilderness, in danger on the sea, in danger among false brothers. <sup>27</sup>I have worked hard and struggled. I've spent many sleepless nights. I've been hungry and thirsty. I've gone without food many times. I've been cold and lacked clothing.

<sup>28</sup>Besides those external matters, there is the daily pressure on me of my concern for all the churches. <sup>29</sup>Who is weak without my being weak? Who falls into sin without my being distressed?

<sup>30</sup>If it is necessary that I boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness. <sup>31</sup>The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, who is eternally blessed, knows that I am not lying. <sup>32</sup>In Damascus, the governor under King Aretas kept the city of Damascus on alert to arrest me, <sup>33</sup>but I was lowered in a basket through a window in the wall and escaped from his hands.

<sup>12:1</sup>I must go on boasting, although there is nothing to be gained. So I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. <sup>2</sup>I know a man in Christ who, fourteen years ago, was carried up to the third heaven (whether in the body, I do not know, or out of the body, I do not know—God knows). <sup>3</sup>And I know that such a man (whether in the body or out of the body, I do not know—God knows) <sup>4</sup>was carried up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words that a man cannot possibly speak. <sup>5</sup>On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except about my weaknesses. <sup>6</sup>Indeed, if I wanted to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain from doing this, so that no one will think more highly of me than what he sees in me or hears from me.

<sup>7</sup>Therefore, to keep me from becoming arrogant due to the extraordinary nature of these revelations, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me, so that I would not become arrogant. <sup>8</sup>Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that he would take it away from me. <sup>9</sup>And he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, because my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will be glad to boast all the more in my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may shelter me.

### Hebrews 4:9-13

<sup>9</sup>So there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God. <sup>10</sup>For the one who enters God's rest also rests from his own work, just as God rested from his work. <sup>11</sup>Therefore, let us make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one will fall into the same pattern of disobedience.

<sup>12</sup>For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any double-edged sword. <sup>10</sup>He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest I speak in parables so that 'even though they see, they may not see, and even though they hear, they may not understand.' <sup>11</sup>This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. <sup>12</sup>Those along the path are the ones who hear it, but then the Devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts to keep them from believing and being saved. <sup>13</sup>Those on the rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no root. The LORD said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I see a king for myself among his sons."

<sup>2</sup>Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me."

The LORD said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the LORD.' <sup>3</sup>Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will let you know what you are to do. You are to anoint for me the person that I point out to you."

<sup>4</sup>So Samuel did what the LORD had told him to do and went to Bethlehem. Trembling with fear, the elders of the city came to meet him. They said, "Do you come in peace?"

<sup>5</sup>He said, "Yes, in peace. I have come to sacrifice to the LORD. Consecrate yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice." He consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

<sup>10</sup>Jesse had seven of his sons pass before Samuel. Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen any of these." <sup>11</sup>Samuel said to Jesse, "Is that all of the young men?"

Jesse said, "There still is the youngest, but he is tending the sheep."

Samuel said to Jesse, "Send for him, for we cannot sit down to eat until he comes."

<sup>12</sup>He sent for him and brought him in. David had red hair and striking eyes, and was good-looking. The LORD said, "Get up! Anoint him, because this is the one."

<sup>3</sup>Strengthen the weak hands, and make the shaky knees steady. <sup>4</sup>Tell those who have a fearful heart: Be strong. Do not be afraid.

Look! Your God will come with vengeance.

With God's own retribution, he will come and save you.

<sup>5</sup>Then the eyes of the blind will be opened,

and the ears of the deaf will be unplugged.

<sup>6</sup>The crippled will leap like a deer,

and the tongue of the mute will sing for joy.

Waters will flow in the wilderness,

and streams in the wasteland.

<sup>7</sup>The burning sand will become a pool,

and in the thirsty ground there will be springs of water.

There will be grass, reeds, and rushes where the haunts of jackals once lay.

# **Epistle**

### 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. <sup>2</sup>If I have the gift of prophecy and know all the mysteries and have all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. <sup>3</sup>If I give away everything I own, and if I give up my body that I may be burned but do not have love, I gain nothing.

<sup>4</sup>Love is patient. Love is kind. Love does not envy. It does not brag. It is not arrogant. <sup>5</sup>It does not behave indecently. It is not selfish. It is not irritable. It does not keep a record of wrongs. <sup>6</sup>It does not rejoice over unrighteousness but rejoices with the truth. <sup>7</sup>It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

<sup>8</sup>Love never comes to an end. But if there are prophetic gifts, they will be done away with; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be done away with. <sup>9</sup>For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part, <sup>10</sup>but when that which is complete has come, that which is partial will be done away with. <sup>11</sup>When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put away childish things. <sup>12</sup>Now we see indirectly using a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I was fully known.

<sup>13</sup>So now these three remain: faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.

### **Holy Gospel**

### Luke 18:31-43

<sup>31</sup>He took the Twelve aside and said to them, "Look, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written through the prophets about the Son of Man will be accomplished. <sup>32</sup>Indeed, he will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, mistreat him, spit on him, <sup>33</sup>flog him, and kill him. On the third day, he will rise again."

<sup>34</sup>They did not understand any of these things. What he said was hidden from them, and they did not understand what was said.

<sup>35</sup>As he approached Jericho, a blind man sat by the road, begging. <sup>36</sup>When he heard a crowd going by, he asked what was happening. <sup>37</sup>They told him that Jesus the Nazarene was passing by. <sup>38</sup>He

called out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" <sup>39</sup>Those who were at the front of the crowd rebuked him, telling him to be quiet. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"

 $^{40}$ Jesus stopped and ordered the man to be brought to him. When he came near, he asked him,  $^{41}$ "What do you want me to do for you?"

He said, "Lord, I want to see again."

<sup>42</sup>Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight. Your faith has saved you."

<sup>43</sup>Immediately he received his sight and began following Jesus, glorifying God. All the people, when they saw this, gave praise to God.
